PARTICIPATION OF NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN DISTRICT COURSES

By statute, school districts may permit a private school or home-based student to participate in selected courses or activities of the public school. Students in grades K-8 may not, however, participate in those courses mandated for private schools and home-based private educational programs by state statutes, (i.e., reading, writing, mathematics, social studies and science.)

School boards operating high school grades are required by state statutes to allow a student enrolled in a private school or a student enrolled in a home-based private education program to take up to two courses during each school semester in the high school provided the following conditions are met: 1) the student has met the standards for admission to high school established by the school district, 2) the student resides in the school district in which the school is located, and 3) the district determines that there is sufficient space in the classroom.
