The Citizens Facility Advisory Committee (CFAC), comprised of 23 community members, held its first committee meeting on April 1, 2019 in the High School Library.

The meeting was well-attended in person and on Facebook Live. It began with a review of the Launching a New Legacy and Launching Forward Studies priorities:

- Create a community campus by building needed facilities and amenities
- Expand hands-on STEAM opportunities
- Address students' social needs with community collaboration
- Offer a wide variety of course offerings and co-curricular actives
- Develop and expand community partnerships
- Implement and sustain up-to-date technology within the schools

The Committee Charge and expectations came next which includes: identifying and evaluating immediate, emerging, and future needs; proposing options/renovations/upgrades; providing purposeful spaces; recommending a cost-effective solution; and serving as information providers and key communicators to the community.

Bray Architects presented the school districts' past facility studies, referendum history and past community survey results. The committee believes this process is a positive next step in accomplishing the priorities as identified in the Launching a New Legacy process with specific focus on facility needs.
