May 6, 2019

Learning Today, Leading Tomorrow

OVERVIEW

The meeting started off with Bray Architects presented the existing conditions report, which included: A building evolution diagram, existing site plan and floor plan, building system summary, preliminary needs assessment, ADA assessment, roof plan, exterior door and window analysis, and engineer reports.

A video tour was presented showing different areas of the school with students present, some areas included: The playground, hallways, locker rooms, and pick-up and drop-off.

After the brief discussion of the existing conditions report, the group took a tour of the Intermediate / Middle School. The tour, which was the main focus of the meeting, was led by Intermediate / Middle School principal Cori Denk. Committee members observed the following:

- Areas of need as identified in the existing conditions report
- Teaching and learning spaces that are serving the school well and those that could use improvement
- All areas of the building (gymnasium, bathrooms, band room, etc.) that support students everyday

Following the tour, Michele Wilberg with PMA Financial Network delivered a presentation titled "Finance 101 Workshop". Her presentation focused on the following:

- · The role of a financial advisor
- How school property taxes are calculated
- Review of 2014-2019 school district tax levy and mill rate
- Comparison of 2018-19 mill rate to other area school districts, the area average, and the state average
- Discussed how the tax impact (mill rate) might be affected by a potential future referendum
- Review of how any new debt (if a referendum were to be approved) would wrap around the existing district debt
