# PROJECT PROGRESS REPORT

Phase 1 ceiling installations at the High School are now completed.



## WHAT'S NEW

- Phase 1 work is wrapped up for the start of the school year.
- Construction will continue in phases, which will allow students to occupy other areas of the building.
- The concrete masonry firewall between the existing building and the new addition is being constructed.
- Foundations for the new cafeteria addition are nearly complete.
- Hallways are being painted.
- The bathrooms are being tiled in the Phase 1 area.
- The concrete tiers have been removed from the music rooms. Level concrete slabs have been installed in these rooms, and new acoustical wall panels have been installed.

## WHAT'S NEXT?

### Elementary School

- Exterior metal stud framing will begin to enclose the new addition.
- Interior metal stud partitions will begin to shape the interior spaces.

### High School

- The next phase of construction will include the new cafeteria addition.

## CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

### Elementary School

- Structural steel construction for the new addition has continued. The first and second floors are nearly complete.
- Installation of face brick at the walls facing the courtyard has commenced.
- The concrete slab on grade has been poured for the new addition.

### Middle School

- Tile, ceilings, and plumbing fixtures are being installed in the bathrooms.
- Mechanical rooftop units are being installed.

### High School

- In Phase 1 areas ceiling installations are being finished.

## Curriculum News, Becky Schmidt, Director of Curriculum & Instruction

During the 2021-22 school year, the district's [2021-22 Columbus Continuity of Learning Plan](#) may be used as a reference to understand how the district will service students through in-person, concurrent, or virtual instruction, all dependent on what the situation allows.

If a student will be quarantined for more than 3 days, the district will offer concurrent instruction to students. If a student is out for 3 days or less, they may keep up on assignments and some resources through Google Classroom.

In general, if a student is eligible for concurrent instruction, this is how it works.

| <b>Grades<br/>6-8</b>  | <p>If a middle school student needs to be quarantined for three or more days due to Covid the family will get an email from Cori Denk the CMS principal to let you know what classes the students will have synchronous learning for and when it will start. In general, the plan will have most classes going virtual except for physical education. If there are different instructions for a class that teacher will notify your student via email to let them know the plan.</p>   |
| <b>Grades<br/>9-12</b> | <p>Students will attend class concurrently through the Google Meet link in their Google Classroom, especially during any whole class instruction. When possible, staff will also connect students concurrently with small groups when appropriate. If this is not feasible, class will be delivered asynchronously through Google Classroom (ex: all physical education courses.)</p>  |

## **Student Services News, Lisa Blochwitz, Director of Student Services**

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### **Columbus School District Pupil Services Department Awarded Grant**

The Conlin Family Fund was established in 2009 in memory of all the Conlin family members and ancestors that have lived in the Columbus, WI area since 1848. This endowment was created to honor Conlin family members and recognize the Columbus community for its support to the Conlin family through the generations. It is also in recognition of what they gave to the Columbus community in many ways, to make this place on earth a better place, and for the community for supporting their efforts.

Five Conlin families emigrated from County Sligo Ireland and settled in the Columbus area in 1848. The Bernard Conlin branch of the family descendants has been part of the Columbus, WI community continuously through 2018. This fund has been established through the Columbus Area Endowment which is an affiliate of the Madison Community Foundation. The first grants were awarded in 2013.

The pupil services department was awarded \$10,000.00 from the Conlin Family Fund to be used to support students in the district with social, emotional and mental health needs. Money is being used to pay for continued universal screening of social emotional and behavioral needs in our students, curriculum to support the social emotional learning competencies of students in grades K-8 and professional development in all buildings.

The Columbus School District and the Pupil Services Department thanks Dr. Joe Conlin and the Madison Community Foundation for their continued support of the growing mental health needs in students in the Columbus Schools.

## FFA Update

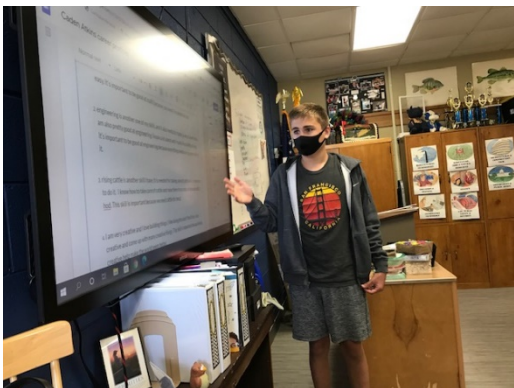
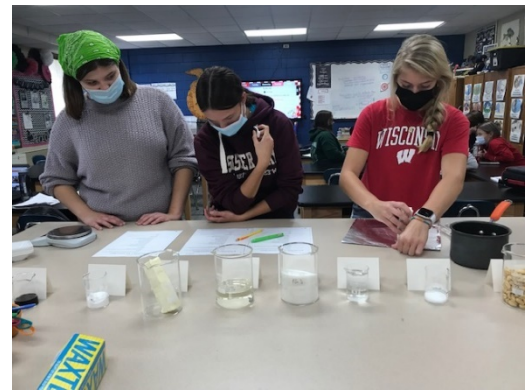
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**FFA Meeting:** The first FFA meeting will be held on Monday, September 20, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. in the high school ag room (Room 107).

# School Nutrition

## First Heritage Day Success!



On September 15th the district served a Hispanic inspired menu of Pork Carnita Tostadas, refried beans, rice, elotes off the cobb, and Tajin tropical fruit salad. The elementary kids were served blue corn chip Pork Carnita Nachos. The kids were crazy about the corn that is usually served by street vendors in Mexico. Cotija is a Mexican cheese similar to parmesan cheese readily available at larger grocery stores or a Mexican grocer. This is our adapted school version for you to try at home.

### Elotes Sauce (makes 1-3/4 cups sauce)

1/2 cup Mexican crema, or sour cream  
1/2 cup mayonnaise  
1/2 cup chopped cilantro  
½ tsp granulated garlic  
1/4 tsp smoked paprika  
2 TBS lime juice, from 1 lime  
1/2 cup cotija cheese, crumbled

Combine all ingredients in a bowl. Mix to combine. After corn has been cooked stir in sauce. The amount of sauce to corn is personal preference. We suggest about 5lbs cooked corn for this recipe.



Some students have noticed new vegetables being served at lunch! What is that yellow? It is carrots! Carrots come in a variety of colors including purple. Same great carrot flavor in fun colors.

Our next Heritage Day will be October 21st featuring cuisine from the Hmong culture inspired by La Crosse Local Cooking with Bao. Did you know, Wisconsin is home of the 3rd largest Hmong population in the United States. The Hmong are members of an ethnic group that have not had a country of their own. During the Vietnam War, the Hmong in Laos aided and partnered with American forces to fight Southeast Asian Communists. After the United States pulled out of Laos, Communist forces retaliated against the Hmong causing thousands to flee and find refuge in refugee camps, many located in rural Wisconsin. Many families relied on their agricultural heritage to make a living growing produce and flowers for local farmers markets making it a perfect fit to highlight during National Farm to School Month. We will be serving up a delicious Ginger Chicken Stir Fry and Purple Sticky Rice.



Supply chain distribution disruptions continue to challenge our ability to always serve what is on the posted menu. We are dedicated to ensuring that we get that proper food for the students so they can have a healthy meal to fuel learning minds. We are working on communicating these changes to students when possible through morning announcements. A new breakfast menu for CES/DCS/CIS/CMS has been updated on the school website after many products on the menu were suddenly unavailable. We are continuing to do our best to substitute a similar product if there is a product shortage.

Currently, all Columbus School District students receive the option of free breakfast and lunch every day as a benefit of a waiver through the USDA. Unfortunately, that has led to a steady decline in eligible families filling out the Free and Reduced Price School Meals application.

In addition to the budget presentation, the community will vote on the tax levy at the Annual Meeting. ## **Facilities Update, Troy Marshall, Facilities Manager**

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Construction projects at CES, CIS/CMS and CHS have been moving along. At CIS/CMS, our two sets of bathrooms have been completed. The students were very excited on the first day to see what was done over summer break. New rooftop air handling units are set to be installed September 25th, 26th, and 27th. Then again, we will install the remainder of these units on October 29th, 30th, and 31st.

At CES, the progress is very visible. Masonry is plugging away on the exterior walls of the gymnasium. There are also crews framing interior and exterior walls in the new classroom area. Next month we will be seeing roof trusses installed and the building getting dried in. It's amazing to watch progress.

At CHS, students were excited to see the completion of new bathrooms, new student lounge, new collaborative area, flooring, and two new single use bathrooms at the south end of the building. The focus of the current phase is now all on the commons/cafeteria/kitchen area. Walls have gone up, and the kitchen is starting to take shape.

Please follow all traffic signs when dropping off or picking up your students. There has been an abundance of illegally parked vehicles around CES and CIS/CMS since the beginning of the school year. Columbus PD will be writing tickets to anyone illegally parked.
