News from the Nurse:

Hello families,

As we near the end of the school year, I wanted to provide you with a few reminders for the end of this year, summer, and the beginning of next school year:

- If your child has medication at school (prescription or over-the-counter), it will need to be picked up by/on Monday, May 23rd. If you cannot make it to the school by/on Monday, May 23rd, medications can also be picked up during the first week of summer school session 1 (week of 6/6/2022-6/10/2022) Any medications that are not picked up by/on Friday, June 10th will be discarded.
- If your child has medications at CES/DCS, they will be moved to CIS/CMS building on May 23rd. This is where you will

need to pick them up if you plan on getting the during the first week of summer school session 1.

- While I know that we are all looking forward to summer break, next school year will be here before you know it! Over the next few months, please call your child's healthcare provider to verify that they are up to date on their immunizations. If they do or will need immunizations in the near future, please get those appointments scheduled as soon as possible.
- ALL medications (prescription and over-the-counter) need to be stored in the office at your child's school. This is to protect the safety of all of our students. If your child requires any medication at school (scheduled or as needed), the proper forms need to be completed. For prescription medications, parent permission, as well as physician orders and signature are required. For over-the-counter medications, only a parent authorization is needed. Students are not allowed to carry medications on them, unless it is for emergency use only, and they have been pre-approved to do so. Please email bbayer@columbus.k12.wi.us for any questions on this.

WHAT'S NEW

- Work in the new addition of the elementary school is nearing completion.
 Construction crews are now working on installing interior finishes and equipment.
- At the high school, phase 3 is nearing completion, and phase 4 is kicking off.
 Work in the health and fitness rooms is nearly complete, while the renovation of the STEAM areas is beginning starting with demolition.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Elementary School

- Lockers have been installed in the new classroom wing.
- · Ceiling installation will finish this month.
- Interior finishes in the new "nest" themed classroom wing is nearly complete with painted tree panels, wood-look plastic laminate wall panels, and circular seating nooks.
- Floor installation has begun in the cafeteria.
- Wall and ceiling finishes have been installed in the cafeteria and kitchen equipment installation is underway.
- Gym infrastructure such as loudspeakers and scoreboards are being installed.

High School

The new Health Room is complete and already being used by students!

High School (continued)

- Construction of soffits is underway, starting with metal stud framing.
- The new STEAM spaces have been reconfigured with the installation of HVAC and plumbing work in these areas.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Looking into the next month, the work schedule includes:

Elementary School

- · Installation of the wood gym floor.
- Gym equipment will be installed, including the sound system, fans, and basketball hoops.
- · Floor finish installation will be complete.

High School

- Window installation in the library, band, and choir rooms.
- The new fitness room will be complete in mid-April.
- Demolition of the STEAM area will continue through April, followed by renovation of those spaces.



Curriculum News, Becky Schmidt, Director of Curriculum & Instruction Reflecting Back, Planning Forward

The vision for Curriculum and Instruction in Columbus School District reads as follows: Curriculum and Instruction in Columbus School District will guarantee equitable access to a comprehensive learning experience that will empower students to be active participants of the greater global community. This is what we strive to do.

During the 2021-22 school year, the district, students, and families faced challenges, and through hard work, we are persevering on the other side. Here are a few things you may notice as we head forward into the summer months.

Summer School- The district is taking advantage of funding available through an ESSER III grant to provide bussing to summer school 2022. By allowing more students the opportunity to attend summer school and emphasizing literacy and math during summer school, the district's goal is to continue to promote growth in literacy and math as well as lessen loss that naturally occurs when students are out of school during the summer months. Bussing for summer school may not be possible in future years, but the district is pleased to be able to offer this opportunity this summer. Open registration for summer school is officially closed; however, some grade levels still have a few seats remaining. If you are still interested in enrolling your child in summer school, please contact their principal directly.

Closing of Columbus Intermediate School- Columbus Elementary School will open in Fall 2022 as a 4K-5 elementary school. That means that over the summer, grades 3-5 will be moved into the new construction. As a result of this move, Columbus Intermediate School needs to be officially closed. At this point, it is a formality, but the district wants to make sure all families understand when it comes across in a future school board agenda that it is just that, a formality that was always part of the plan once the community generously approved the referendum for construction to make CES a 4K-5 elementary school.

End of Year Surveys- In a few short weeks, all families of Columbus School District will be invited to participate in an end of year survey. These surveys will help the district on its path of continuous improvement as planning for the 2022-23 school year continues throughout the summer.

JEDI- A quick note on JEDI Virtual School. Heading into the 2021-22 school year, in response to feedback from families, Columbus School District joined a consortium of school districts who offer online instruction through JEDI Virtual School as an option for students. The district will maintain JEDI as an option heading into the 2022-23 school year. Columbus resident students who wish to enroll in JEDI remain Columbus School District students and are eligible for all the supports and co-curricular opportunities available to students who attend in person. If JEDI Virtual School is an option that you wish to discuss further, please contact the principal of the school your child would otherwise be attending. Families who wish to enroll their child in JEDI Virtual School for the start of the 2022-23 school year must contact the school district before **July 18, 2022**.

Transition Night

On Wednesday, April 13, students and families were invited to attend "Transition Night" hosted by Columbus Transition Coordinator/Special Educator, Jahlieh Henderson. The targeted population for Transition Night was students ages 14-21 who receive special

education services and are interested in learning more about county and state services. Experts came to share insight and information from the Columbia County Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC), the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR), and WISPACT (a special needs trust organization). All presenters focused on how students with disabilities can live, work, and thrive in their communities with focused support and individualized programming. Families were able to ask questions, meet individually with the presenters, and gain valuable information for their young adults' futures. It was a great night! Thanks to all who attended.

Peer Model Program

2022-2023 School Year Columbus School District



Columbus' Peer Model program is designed for children with and without disabilities to learn from and form relationships with their peers. The classroom consists of three-year-old students identified with special needs and their typically developing peers. Our class takes place Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday mornings from 9:00-11:45. The classroom is led by a dually certified Special Education Teacher and supported by an Educational Support Professional, Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapist, and Speech and Language Therapist.

Peer Models Must:

Children who turn 4 after September 1, 2022 are eligible to apply.

Complete a preschool screeningincluding participation in a mock class

Be able to take care of all toileting needs

Communicate effectively in English.

Complete an Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ3)

Complete an informal speech sound profile.

Food Service News, Irene Pawlisch, Director of Food Service

We have had a year of many changes. In preparation for additional changes with the new K-5 kitchen, I have shifted staff around in some of the buildings. This is allowing staff to get to know their new job duties and hit the ground running in the fall.

I am also looking at an entire culture shift in how we approach serving our foods. We will be offering more options across all schools. We have a diverse community and our food offerings will reflect the community. This includes families that mostly eat out on the run, make food from boxes, and those that do all things scratch cooking. It is a balancing act of giving favorites to all groups.

As a part of this culture shift, I will be soliciting students, family, and staff input in establishing long-term goals and short-term steps to reach those goals. Some of these steps will include nutrition outreach programs in the classroom and after school. What I don't know is what is most important to you.



One Chocolate Milk has 14 grams of added sugar compared to white milk. That is an extra 1.12 Tablespoons of sugar in each milk.

If a student drinks chocolate milk every day for Lunch and snack (10 milks) a week that is nearly 3/4 cup of extra sugar a week.

An average school month is 20 days. If a student enjoyed a chocolate milk for lunch and snack for all 20 days...

> 20 x 2 = 40 Milks 40 x 1.12 = 44.8 TBS 44.8 / 16 = 2.8 cups

The purpose of a school nutrition program is to provide equity of learning by providing healthy nutrition to feed bodies and fuel learning minds.
